



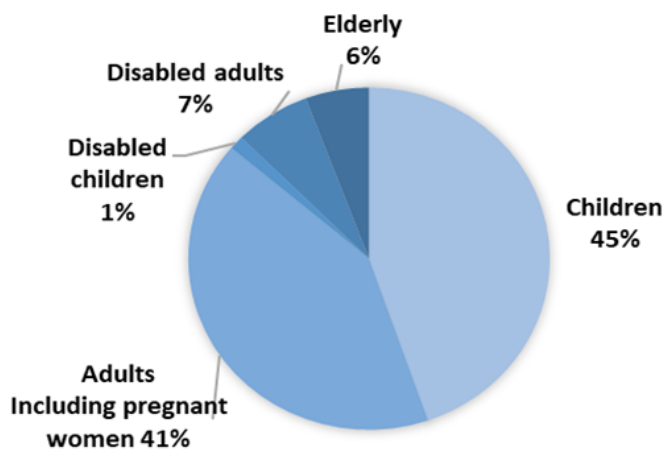
Medicaid in Alaska

Medicaid provides health coverage and long-term care services for low-income Alaskans.

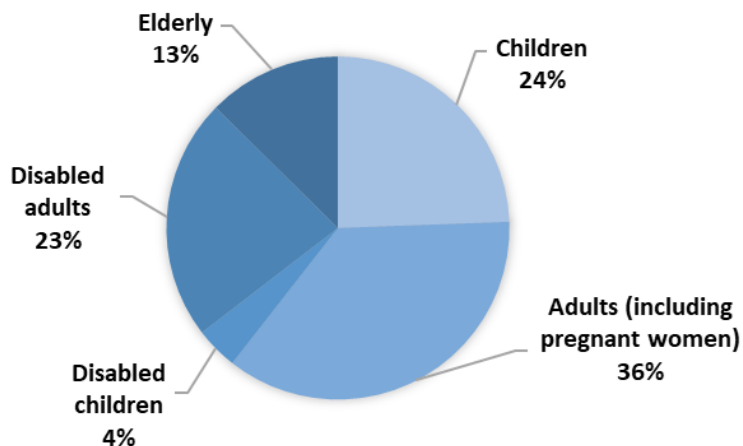
Medicaid serves Alaska's most vulnerable: children, seniors, people with disabilities, and very low income or working poor.

GENERAL FUND SPENDING WHO DOES MEDICAID SERVE?

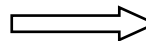

Changes in Medicaid enrollment and spending

Alaska is now covering 79,000 (63%) more Medicaid enrollees per month and using 11% fewer state dollars* than it did four years ago.

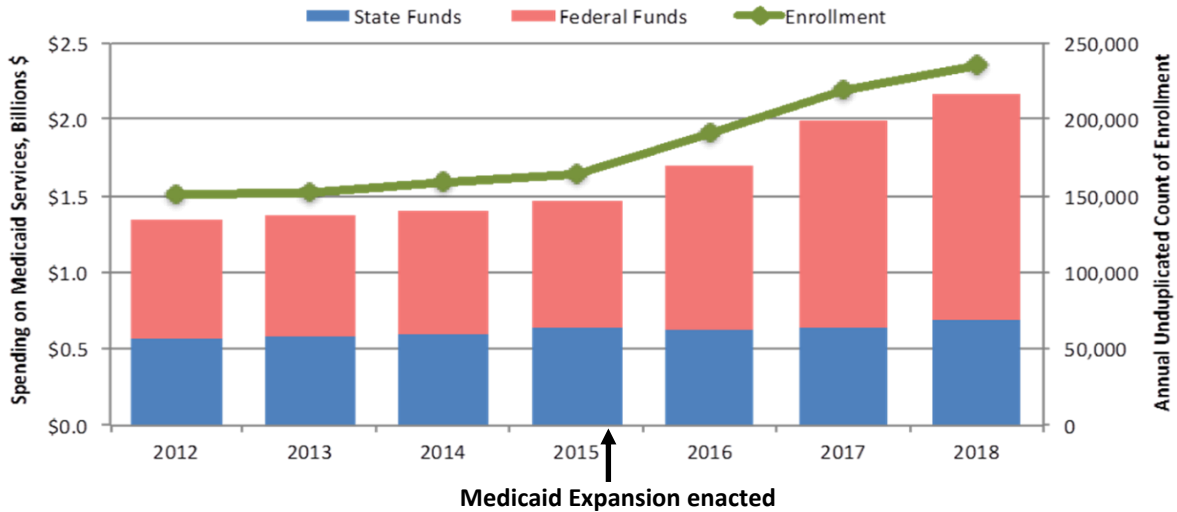

Medicaid Enrollment & Spending in Alaska

2012 – 2018 Actuals

The chart below shows that during the past four years enrollment has increased due to Alaska's economic recession and Medicaid expansion. However, general spending has been virtually flat, while federal spending has increased. Alaska has been able to provide health care to more people in need for little additional cost.

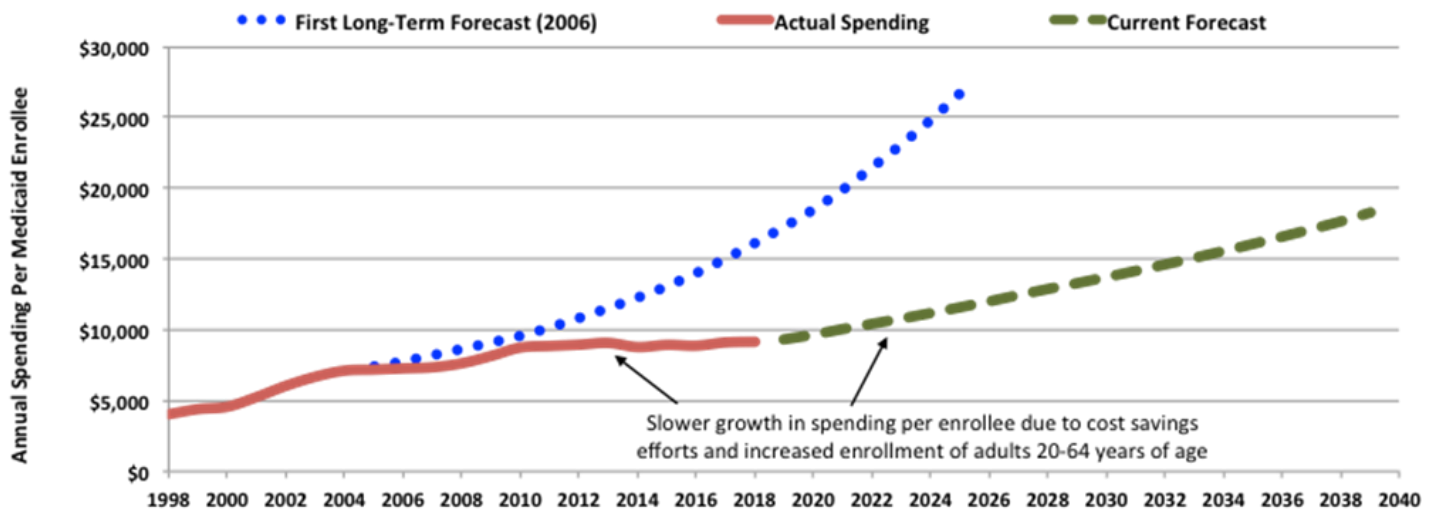

Medicaid Spending per Enrollee

1998 – 2018 Actuals and 2019 – 2039 Projected

The Alaska legislature and Department of Health and Social Services have implemented reforms and cost saving efforts that have helped hold Medicaid spending per enrollee flat. The graph below shows how the per-enrollee cost curve has turned down and held steady, well below the original forces. The lower cost curve will contribute to slower growth rates and increased savings into the future.
